




### Climate

Devonport has mild to warm summers and cold winters with. Most days from January to March average 20°C to 25°C with sunshine almost every day. The warmest and driest days can pass 30°C but the humid air from the Bass Strait often prevents extreme heatwaves. Winters are more overcast with more rainfall, July and August being the wettest months of the year.
