AFRICAN TRIATHLON UNION (herein referred to as the "ATU") residing at International Cairo Stadium, New Federations Building #11, Cairo, Egypt

- 1. Introduction: The purpose of this agreement is to:
 - 1.1. Support the strategic development goals of ATU which are:
 - a.) Activate the New Federations and provide new and emerging federations with resources for development;
 - b.) Athlete and coach development;
 - c.) Technical and Event Development;
 - 1.2. Provide the personnel, resources, and budget allocations to support ATU achieving their strategic development goals;
 - 1.3. Provide a sustainable structure for accessing resources and programmes and for reporting on a quarterly basis for the development projects.

The above budget figure (200.000 US\$) was approved by the ATU Executive Board and the ITU Executive Board.

The ITU made the following recommendations to the above projects:

- The Administration costs in ATU is over the 20% of the total as recommended by ITU to all Continental Confederations.
- ITU would recommend to set a three (3) month project re-confirmation deadline with all host National Federations prior to each project in order to ensure a better outcome of each project.
- The Development Event project as per ITU Executive Board approvel (Gold Coast)
 has not been considered for 2019 due to the launch of the Triathlon Junior African
 Cups.
- The first National Championships event as per ITU Executive Board approval (Gold Coast) has not been considered for 2019, as there are many re-activated or new NFs seeking for support to keep their National Championship alive. Instead of a technical support for organizing National Championships has been assigned for 4 National Federations in 2019.
- 3. Obligations and Reporting Procedures: ITU and ATU will ensure all projects are clearly planned and funds and resources are managed in a transparent way, including:
 - 3.1. Work with the ITU Sport/Development Department to clearly outline the procedures, content, outcomes and reports for each project. The ITU Development Sport/Department will provide forms for all project planning, funding and reporting.
 - 3.2. All justification should be sent to the ITU Development Department, based in Lausanne, Av. Rhodanie 54. 1007 Lausanne, Vaud, Switzerland.
 - 3.3. Allocating funds for programmes and activities which will take place at the beginning of the year. ITU will paid one quarter of the total amount during that period. Further payments will be done once ATU justified the amounts received. ATU and ITU Administration will agree on which amounts will be paid directly to ATU for their disbursement, and which are to be paid by ITU.
 - 3.4. File semester (6 months period starting 1st of January) project reports with expenses supported by receipts and reasons for the expenditure. ITU Administration and Finance will provide the format for the reports.
 - 3.5. ITU will provide support funds to cover costs of the projects marked as ITU Expense on the Project and Budget allocation in order to meet the development needs of the region.
- 4. Term: This Agreement shall take effect for the year 2019.
- 5. Notices: All notices, consents, approvals and statements hereunder shall be given to the respective addresses of the Parties, which is the headquarters of each organization.
- 6. Governing Law: The parties shall make every effort to resolve any dispute arising out of this Agreement in an amicable manner conforming to the spirit of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Canton de Vaud (Switzerland). The ATU and ITU shall use utmost good faith in attempting to resolve all disputes under this Agreement. Any dispute arising from or related to the present Agreement will be submitted exclusively to the jurisdiction of the Court of Arbitration for Sport in Lausanne, Switzerland and settled definitively in accordance with the Code of Sports-related Arbitration. The panel will consist of three arbitrators and the language of

arbitration will be English. Each Party shall bear its own legal costs relating directly or indirectly to the preparation of, and performance of, its obligations under this Agreement.
