#### TREASURERS REPORT

- 1. As you see we made a profit of \$3k this year compared to last years loss of \$11k. Big picture this is all down to the \$19k we made (net) from the WTCS races.
- 2. The biggest income item shown in the financials is from our "Races and Camps" which of course comes with a commensurately large expense item. Still, a handy \$27k positive difference most of which coming from the WTCS per Note 1 above.
- 3. The next biggest numbers are the "pass throughs" which are meaningless as far as our finances go but demonstrate the level of funding, particularly our elite athletes receive, particularly from the BOA. Our role is to ensure the paperwork required is completed and passed on and pay out the funds when we receive them.
- 4. Some reduction in membership dues is to be expected but the extent seems to be extreme and something for the next Exec to work on. Jacking up the one day memberships has been discussed and seems to be one potential solution.
- 5. BF&M upped their Building sponsorship back to the \$2k level which was something of a pleasant surprise. Butterfield and Vallis paid their \$2k the day after I asked for it.
- 6. The \$19k of funding shown as income is actually the amount of funding used to offset items in the Expenses . The unused funding is shown in Accounts Payable and will reduce as we use it in future. This does make sense on the basis that if we don't use it we have to give it back. (But it's a great "liability" to have!) The "Funding 2022" schedule provides detail.
- 7. We are required to produce the Cash Flow Statement but its not something to which I usually pay much attention. This year though it looks dramatic, again because of the unused funding in our account.
- 8. Most of the \$453 Accounts Receivable has been collected since the year end.
- 9. Being a one-off major initiative, the Carifta Triathlon has it's own schedule detailing related Income and and Expenditure
- 10. The Directors have confirmed there has been no suspicion of money laundering or terrorism funding connected with the Association's activities throughout 2022.
- 11. In closing, the Association's Net Worth at \$64k is very healthy healthy (it was \$35k at 12/31/2015). Maintaining this level will be challenging if, as seems likely we don't get the boost from the WTCS event in future years.
